We enjoyed our first PE lesson, we had fun learning how to move safely in the hall and practising our listening skills. We talked about the importance of keeping ourselves and others safe by finding a space, moving carefully, and stopping when asked. We are very proud of how well they worked together. We are looking forward to developing our PE skills throughout the year! In RE we looked at the Bible and why it is a special book, we then talked about books that are special to us. Literacy

We found a mysterious 'hole' in the playground and have enjoyed using our imaginations to think what it could be and what, if anything could live down there. We sorted through pictures of animals that could live underground. We were introduced to our literacy book, 'The Something.' We also started our RWI phonics lessons this week. This week we have been focusing on the sounds 'm', 'a', 's', 'd' and 't.'

In drawing club we have looked at animal books and drawn our favourite animal from the story. We also drew a 'comfy bed' for Mr Bear from 'Peace at Last.'
