#### Headlice

We want to inform you that we have had a number of cases of head lice. Head lice are common among schoolaged children. We ask that all parents check their child's hair and scalp carefully, especially behind the ears and at the nape of the neck. If lice or nits (eggs) are found, please begin treatment immediately using an appropriate

over-the-counter or prescription lice treatment. Be sure to follow the product instructions closely and remove nits with a fine-toothed comb. Personal items such as bedding, clothing, hats, and brushes should be washed in hot water and dried on high heat. To help prevent the spread, please remind your child not to share hats, combs or hair accessories. Thank you for your co-operation in keeping our school community healthy.
