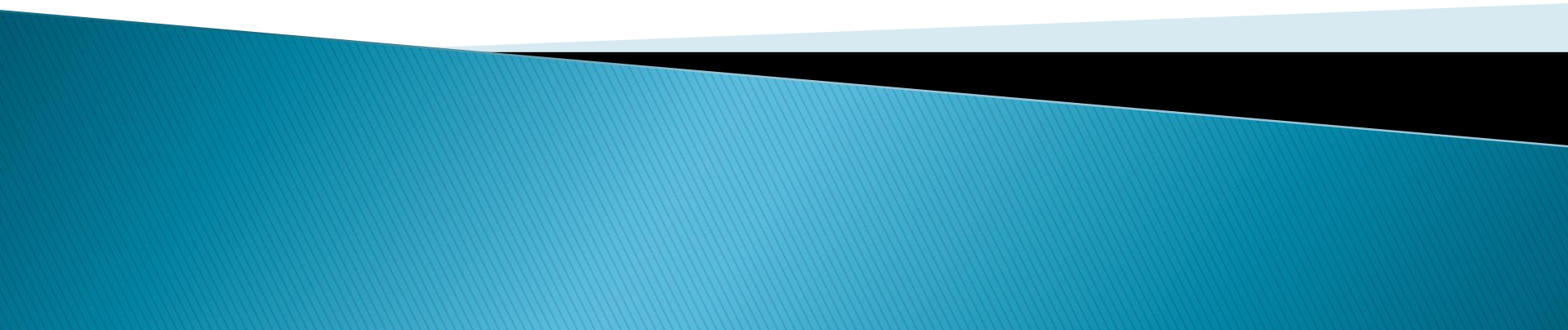

Day 1: Monday 27th June

7:15am to 7:30 am: Arrive at school.

All children are to wear their Highfield Leavers' Hoodie. They will be given these on Friday 24th June.

Please don't arrive before 7:15am. Although staff will be here before this time, we will need time to load coach with what is needed so that when families arrive, we can give parents and children our full attention.

Children will need to bring their own packed lunch for day 1. School will not be able to make any packed lunches as the kitchen will not be open at the time when we leave.

7.30am: Depart school – please don't be late; we don't want to leave anybody behind!



Day 1: Monday 27th June

12:00pm: Approximate time of arrival in London.

From past London trips, we can estimate our time of arriving in London will be about 12:00pm.

We will have one stop on our way at a motorway services to use the toilets.

Lunch: The children will be able to eat their lunch on the coach on the way to London.



Day 1: Monday 27th June

National History Museum: When we arrive in London, we go to the National History Museum first. Here we will stay together as a whole group and explore the exhibitions there.

London Eye: After the museum, we are collected by the coach and taken to The London Eye. The class will be split into two groups with two adults per group.



Day 1: Monday 27th June

Evening Meal: After visiting The London Eye, we make our way to Azzurro for our evening meal. The children will have a three course meal (they have already chosen their starters, mains and desserts).

Accommodation: At the end of the day, we are collected by the coach and taken to our accommodation. The children will then be able to unpack and settle in their rooms before bedtime.

* Anything that the children need for the day time needs to be in their day bag and not their case. The cases will be in the underhold of the coach until we get to our accommodation in the evening.


Day 2: Tuesday 28th June

12:00pm: Approximate time we get back to accommodation

- The children can take a second set of clothes to change into before going to the theatre in the evening
- The children may take a bag of sweets for inside the theatre. It will cost much less than buying one there!

11:00am: Harry Potter Studio Tour

6:00 to 7:00pm: Approx. time home





Year 6 Residential trip to London: Code of Conduct

It is essential that everyone agrees to these simple rules to ensure a safe and enjoyable visit. Failure to comply with these safety rules may result in your parents being requested to collect you from London.

- Obey all instructions or requests quickly and without question
- Listen carefully to all instructions given
- Be respectful to all staff at all times
- Be punctual at all times
- Never leave the centre/attractions/your group without permission from staff
- Remain with your group at all times
- Treat everyone you meet during the visit with courtesy and consideration, especially in busy or crowded situations
- Keep your belongings safe and bedrooms tidy at all times. There will be regular room inspections
- Do not enter any other bedroom apart from your own
- Inappropriate language will not be tolerated
- Wear seatbelts at all times on any coach. Keep the coach clean and tidy
- Do not bring or buy chewing gum or fizzy drinks
- Go to bed and sleep at the agreed times. With a busy schedule it is essential that everyone, including staff, get their rest so they can function and supervise you the next day
- All I-pads, tablets and games consoles are your sole responsibility
- Mobile phones can only be taken if they have their SIM card removed and are not to be used for phone calls, messages, social media or accessing the internet
- It is forbidden to take photographs/videos of anybody without their permission
- It is forbidden to upload photographs/videos of anybody on the internet/social media without their permission
