Recognise that living things produce offspring of the same kind, but normally offspring vary and are not identical to their parents. Identify how animals and plants are adapted to suit their environment in different ways and that adaptation may lead to evolution		Be introduced to the idea that characteristics are passed from parents to their offspring i.e. different breeds of dogs and what happens when e.g. Labradors are crossed with poodles. Appreciate that variation in offspring over time can make animals more or less able to survive in particular environments, e.g. how a giraffe's neck gets longer. Find out about the work of palaeontologists such as Mary Anning and about how Charles Darwin and Alfred Wallace developed their ideas on evolution		End Point Enquiry Question: Why is evolution still classified as a theory?
