## **Change to our Age Range**

Last March we applied to the Department for Education to change our age range so we can welcome some nursery-aged children into Otters Class alongside our reception aged children. We are pleased to confirm that the Regional Director has approved this change for Warmingham CE Primary School. To complete the process, we now need to formalise the change through a Deed of Variation, which is being handled by CDAT's legal team.

Bringing nursery children into Otters Class will allow younger children to benefit from an early start with learning led by a qualified teacher. Our nursery children will develop confidence, language and social skills in a nurturing environment through planned, teacher-led activities that promote early literacy, numeracy and inquisitive play. The reception children will gain leadership opportunities and learn from their younger peers, deepening their own understanding as they model routines and cooperative behaviours. We believe this mixed-age approach supports strong social development and continuity of learning for all pupils and helps create a calm, consistent classroom culture.

Mrs Allen will be supported by another member of staff to help her ensure the needs of every child are met, with targeted small-group work and tailored support where needed. Having a qualified teacher at the heart of Otters Class means teaching is informed by professional assessment and curriculum expertise, ensuring early years practice is purposeful and closely aligned with what children need to be ready for school. This structured, expertise-led environment helps children settle more quickly, builds strong foundations for learning and smooths the transition into full-time Reception, with children arriving better prepared socially, emotionally and academically.

We will only be offering places to children who are rising three-year-olds. This means children may start in the September following their third birthday, so in effect they will turn four during their nursery school year. This arrangement gives children a full year of settled, age-appropriate early years provision before moving seamlessly into Reception, helping them grow in confidence and readiness for the next stage of their education.

We have also been awarded a grant to install two additional toilets to meet the needs of our youngest children. Over the coming weeks, I will be finalising our admissions procedures and completing the remaining legal steps. Our aim is to start offering places from January 2026, but it is more likely that admissions will begin over the spring term once everything has been completed. I will keep you updated on our progress.

We understand that change can feel unsettling, which is why we will take our time to ensure routines, staffing and the environment are right before we open to nursery-aged children. This careful approach will help us provide a safe, well-resourced setting for the youngest children and ensure a positive experience for the whole school community.

If your child was born between **1 September 2021 and 31 July 2022** (to join us this school year, when we open) or **1 September 2022 and 31 July 2023** (to start nursery in September 2026), and you would like to express an interest, please let Mrs Marsden know.



#### **Wellies Needed**

As the winter months approach, every child needs either a pair of wellies or walking boots to keep in school so they can play safely in the woodland area, which gets extremely muddy. Wellies and walking boots will be stored on the outdoor racks overnight; please ensure they are named clearly so we can return items to the correct child. Thank you for helping us keep children warm, dry and able to enjoy the outdoors whatever the weather.

# **Bread and Butter Thing**

Bread and Butter Thing runs affordable, community food clubs that provide nutritious, low-cost food bags made from high-quality surplus items. Anyone can join without a referral or means test. Members typically pay a small weekly fee for several bags of food, making shopping far more affordable for families and individuals.
