Pupil Voice Workshop - A Celebration of Vision, Advocacy & Spirituality

We're thrilled to share that Warmingham has been invited to lead a workshop at next month's Senior Leaders Conference, hosted by Chester DBE, in recognition of our powerful work around pupil voice.

Over the past four years, groups of Year 5 and Year 6 children have taken part in pupil-led research projects exploring our school's Christian distinctiveness, supported by one of our governors, Mrs Margaret Blease-Bourne. Each year, the children have chosen a theme that matters deeply to our community:

🦊 Year 1: Understanding "Let Your Light Shine"

Year 2: Developing a shared definition of spirituality

Let Year 3: Exploring courageous advocacy



Last year's group – Emily, Rogan, Oscar and Seb – will be joining Mrs Blease-Bourne and myself on 20th November to share how this work has shaped our school's vision and culture.

The process is simple but deeply impactful: children carry out initial research, identify areas for improvement, work on these over the spring term with myself, and revisit their findings to see what's changed. It's a transformative journey that embeds values into our everyday practice – a bit like a stick of rock, with our Christian ethos running right through the middle.

As principal, I believe that children must be at the heart of everything we do. Their voices are incredibly powerful, and this work has helped staff and pupils alike to see how vision, advocacy, and spirituality connect to a wider purpose. It's been a privilege to watch our children lead with such insight and passion.

We're proud to be sharing our journey with other schools – and even prouder of the children who've made it happen.

The School Development Plan (SDP) is a strategic document that outlines our school's key priorities for improvement and growth each academic year. It's our roadmap for ensuring Warmingham continues to flourish, with every child receiving the very best education and experience.

Each year, our plan focuses on three main priorities:

- → **Christian Distinctiveness and Behaviour** ~ We aim to strengthen our Christian ethos and values, ensuring they are woven into every aspect of school life. This includes nurturing positive behaviour and creating a caring, respectful community.
- → **Core Subjects**: English, Maths, Science and RE ~ These subjects form the foundation of our curriculum. We focus on raising standards, improving teaching and learning, and ensuring all children make strong progress.
- → **Connected Curriculum** ~ Our Connected Curriculum brings learning to life by linking subjects together in meaningful ways. It helps children see the bigger picture and understand how knowledge connects across different areas.

At the heart of our School Development Plan is a clear intention: to place children at the centre of everything we do. It's a strategic tool that drives improvement, helps us reflect on our progress, and ensures our vision is lived out in everyday practice.

We're pleased to share that the governing body approved this year's SDP at their meeting earlier this week, and I'm now in a position to share our specific targets and actions with you:

Priority 1: Further deepen the school's vision and Christian distinctiveness by continuing to cultivate a spiritually rich, inclusive, and socially conscious school community where every child and adult is empowered to "Let Your Light Shine" by living out Christian values, embracing courageous advocacy, and upholding children's rights across all aspects of school life.

- 1a) Deepen whole-school understanding of 'Let Your Light Shine'.
- 1b) Strengthen the children's knowledge of world religions as part of RE Questful.
- 1c) Ensure Collective Worship (CAW) is engaging and promotes spiritual development.

- 1d) Spiritual reflection and courageous advocacy are visible in planning and pupil work, with children confidently exploring justice, compassion, and personal growth.
- 1e) Staff apply trauma-informed strategies effectively, reducing behavioural incidents and enhancing emotional support for pupils affected by adverse experiences.
- 1f) Children understand and advocate for their rights, with respect and dignity embedded in school culture—culminating in successful achievement of the Gold Award.

Priority 2: To ensure every child makes good to outstanding progress in all subjects by developing high-quality teaching, targeted support, and a curriculum that nurtures excellence, creativity, and confidence.

- 2a) English To accelerate progress in writing and foster a love of reading across the school.
- 2b) Early Reading and Phonics To ensure consistent, high-quality phonics lessons that lays strong foundations for reading and writing.
- 2c) Mathematics To accelerate progress in maths to ensure all non-SEN children reach ARE and our more able children demonstrate that they are working at greater depth in class and on test papers.
- 2d) Assessments To align assessment systems with CDAT expectations and support teachers in identifying progress, gaps, and next steps.

Priority 3: To ensure our curriculum remains broad, balanced, and engaging by reviewing its alignment with national expectations and developing meaningful links with external partners to enhance learning opportunities.

- 3a) To ensure the Connected Curriculum remains broad, balanced, and engaging by aligning it with the updated National Curriculum and strengthening progression, coherence, and pupil engagement across all subjects.
- 3b) Develop external links to enrich learning.
