We will start by identifying our audience before carefully selecting our vocabulary and grammar to enhance the story. After describing the setting will be skilfully integrating dialogue to advance the story.

As **mathematicians**, we will be focusing on fractions, decimals and percentages.


As **readers**, we will take part in year group reading sessions with a focus on fluency, comprehension and inference skills.

This half term we will be using the book:

As **historians**, we will be using a range of resources including some historical artefacts to discover some interesting facts about Vikings. We will then be focusing our historical study on how the Vikings were able to conquer and occupy four continents at once. We will also be looking at the other interventions which helped improve their life style.

As **theologians**, we will explore the book of Daniel to discover that there is far more to his story than just his escape from the lion's den. We will deepen our understanding of Jewish dietary laws and reflect on how Daniel's choices were influenced by his faith. We will also consider the challenges faced by Christians living in countries where they are persecuted today, asking the key question: "Did Daniel make the right choice?"

As **international speakers**, we will be continuing to learn a selection of the key phonemes to facilitate accurate and authentic pronunciation as part of our language learning experience. We will also be continuing to learn how to say fruits and vegetables in Spanish.



## Badgers Class Half Termly Overview Spring 1 2026

As **artists**, we will be learning about how the Vikings were pioneers of craft and international trade. We will then be developing our sculpture skills whilst using one of the Viking interventions: the potter's wheel.

As **computer scientists**, we will be discovering how databases help us store, organize, and retrieve information efficiently. This unit introduces us to databases beyond simple branching structures. We will design and create our own databases, as well as query existing ones to find answers to specific questions. By the end of the unit, we will have explored single and multiple table databases and learned how to use them to solve real-world problems.

As **musicians**, we will be exploring the power of the human voice as a tool for musical and poetic expression. Our Viking theme will inspire us to create strong, dramatic vocal performances that tell stories of Norse legends. We will experiment with vocal techniques to evoke the mood and atmosphere of Viking sagas, and work collaboratively to compose music that reflects the strength and spirit of these ancient tales.

As **sports people**, we will be focusing on developing our gymnastic and swimming skills.
