## *‘Let Your Light Shine’*

*Matthew 5:16*

Time really does fly in school – blink, and suddenly it’s Friday again! It’s been another busy, joyful week here at Warmingham, filled with the kind of experiences that make our children love coming to school each day.

This week, our Year 4–6 children began their swimming lessons. At Warmingham, the children have the opportunity to attend swimming sessions three times throughout their time with us, each block lasting at least ten weeks for a full hour a week. Once they confidently meet the national expectation of swimming 25 metres, our instructors focus on developing technique and, for our strongest swimmers, introducing essential life-saving skills. It’s wonderful to watch their progress as they journey from the shallow end to the deep end over the three years—always growing in confidence and ability.

On Wednesday, Squirrels’ Class had a very exciting (and slightly noisy!) Stone Age workshop for their WOW starter. If you heard a lot of grunting, you didn’t imagine it! The session - funded by the fantastic fundraising efforts of our PTA - brought the Stone Age to life in the most brilliant way. Do take a look at the photos on Facebook. I couldn’t help but chuckle when the ‘Stone Age woman’ first approached the children; despite knowing she was an actor, they all instinctively shuffled backwards. A sign of a very convincing performance!

We would also like to extend a huge thank you to the PTA for the *many* other opportunities they are helping to fund this year. They have covered the cost of entry tickets to Shrewsbury Prison for Badgers’ Class and will be supporting the purchase of eggs and an incubator for Otters as part of their learning, and a trip to Knowsley Safari for Hedgehogs’ Class. They are also contributing towards the cost of the riverboat tickets when Year 6 head to London to celebrate the end of their SATs as well as paying for the cost of the coaches for the residentials. Details for the Knowsley Safari trip for Hedgehogs’ Class will be coming out soon. Without the PTA’s support, we simply wouldn’t be able to offer such rich and memorable experiences for the children.

## MAGMA MATHS

Over the past week, the children have been exploring Magma Maths, a fantastic app designed to strengthen their mathematical understanding through quick, adaptive practice. The children have really enjoyed using it in school, and many have already shown growing confidence as they work through the different challenges.

One of the great benefits of Magma Maths is that it adapts to each child. As the children answer questions, the programme identifies areas they have mastered and areas where they may need more practice. This creates a personalised learning journey that supports progress and builds fluency in key skills.

Children can also access Magma Maths at home.

They can:

- complete tasks set by their class teacher, or
- work through the *Practise* section, which is automatically generated based on the questions they've already answered.

Magma Maths can be accessed either through the app (available on most devices) or via the website. Each child has their own unique QR code in their reading record, which they can scan to log in quickly and easily.
