



Have you ever spent any time people watching? Sitting in a coffee shop looking at all the different people who are there. All the different ages and races, all the different fashion choices and conversations, all those who make eye contact and smile, or avoid eye contact and hide. Life goes in waves and you can often see those who are under pressure and those who are celebrating. Those who are enjoying a break and those who are grabbing the moments that are in front of them with all their might.
