Lakeland 100 – Keep Going!

The other day I was in Coniston and by coincidence it was the start of the Lakeland 100 and Lakeland 50 long distance trail races. These are remarkable. The 100 “miler” is actually 105 miles long and has 6300m of uphill, the 50 “miler” has 3000m of up. They are quite spectacular. The winners take around 19 hours for the 100 and around 7 for the 50. 100 miles on trails, through the night in 19 hours! Just sensational. The cut off is 40 hours!



I honestly don't know how people take on that kind of event. It takes an incredible mindset to keep going. I am in awe of all those who take on such a feat, navigating in the dark, running uphill, running for up to 40 hours straight!

As I was reflecting on the achievements of the amazing competitors I was reminded of a verse in Philippians

I can do all this through him who gives me strength. Phil 4:13

Most of us will never start the Lakeland 50 never mind the 100 but many will know how difficult life can be, how hard it is sometimes just to keep going. Many face uphill struggles each day, whether that is in challenging work places, dealing with grief, family crisis, our ill health or that of those we love. The list goes on and so, it seems, does the battle.

The words of St Paul to the Philippians were written against a background of struggle. Paul was explaining that he had found the key to keeping going, through every situation. Paul's ability to keep going through struggles was found in Jesus, who gave him strength.

If you are struggling, have you thought about reaching out to Jesus in prayer? It may be that your life feels like a 100 miles uphill race through the dark right now, but take heart, as Isaiah reminds us

Those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint. Isaiah 40:31

We can keep going, we can find strength in God to do so. Oh, and if you are one of those people who has completed the Lakeland 50 or 100, WELL DONE!

Prayer for Wisdom and Guidance




There is no meeting in August.

Please contact the Churchwardens to find out more about any of the above roles.


Church Magazine
