## Warmingham Storm to Victory!



Alongside the sporting competitions and tournaments, we take part in with the Middlewich Community Partnership (a group of local primary schools and Middlewich High), our children also have the opportunity to participate in sporting events with the CDAT schools in our cluster - Bosley St Mary's, Bunbury, St Oswald's, Brereton, Astbury St Mary's and Wybunbury Delves.

This week, a group of Year 6 children from Badger's class proudly represented Warmingham in a CDAT hockey tournament hosted at Brereton. They played each school twice, drawing their opening match before going on to win all of their remaining games.

Their determination paid off as they battled it out against the other schools and secured victory with an impressive total of 11 goal lead! Their teamwork, sportsmanship and, for some, the courage to step outside their comfort zone shone through in every match.

Some of the children in Squirrels Class who took part in the MCP football tournament, finishing in an impressive second place overall. They represented the school brilliantly, showing excellent teamwork, determination and outstanding sportsmanship throughout.

## Black History Month Project

During the next half term, pupils will be contributing to a shared project alongside other schools. This will include creative work such as singing, artwork and short performances, all reflecting important messages about racial justice and our shared humanity.

These individual contributions will then be brought together into one powerful collective video, which will be shared in October as part of Black History Month.

We feel proud to be part of this inspiring project and are looking forward to seeing our children's creativity and understanding shine through. It promises to be a valuable and memorable experience for everyone involved.



### Residential Visits 2026–2027

We are already beginning to plan next year's residential visits and hope to be able to share more detailed information with you next half term.

As you know, at Warmingham we are proud to offer every child from Year 1 onwards the opportunity to take part in a residential experience. These visits provide invaluable learning opportunities beyond the classroom - helping children to develop independence, confidence and resilience, while also creating lasting memories with their friends.



We are currently planning for three separate residential next year. Hedgehogs will take part in an outdoor learning experience linked closely to their topic work, Squirrels Class will enjoy a forest school-based residential with creative and artistic elements, and Badgers will have the opportunity to experience more adventurous activities such as rock climbing, kayaking and abseiling.

We are also exploring the feasibility of parent transport for the Hedgehogs and Squirrels residentials, as both centres are within a reasonable distance. With the rising cost of coach travel, this is something we are considering carefully, as coach hire would otherwise require significant PTA fundraising support.
