Year 6's London Adventure: A Day to Remember!

On Tuesday, our Year 6 children embarked on an unforgettable trip to London. For many, it was their very first-time riding on the Tube – a thrilling introduction to one of the world's most iconic transport systems.

The day began with an exciting journey across London by Underground, where the children marvelled at the hustle and bustle around them. Once back above ground, we boarded a boat for a scenic cruise along the River Thames. Departing from Westminster Pier, the children were captivated as the boat glided past some of London's most remarkable landmarks on its way to the Tower of London.

We then walked across the famous Tower Bridge, taking in breath-taking views of the river and city skyline. At the Tower of London, the children enjoyed their lunch surrounded by history as they watched the world go by.

Still buzzing with excitement, the adventure continued with a walk along the riverbank before crossing the Millennium Bridge (much to the children's disappointment when it didn't wobble as they had hoped!) to the Tate Modern. Here, there were some fascinating conversations as the children shared their thoughts and interpretations of the wide range of modern artworks on display. We then continued along the riverbank to see Shakespeare's Globe.

No London trip is complete without sampling local treats, and our Year 6 pupils enjoyed a delicious stop at Borough Market.

The day was rounded off with another Tube journey – from London Bridge to Euston – before settling down for dinner at Pizza Express.

This trip was more than just an outing; it was a journey of discovery. The children not only experienced the wonders of both historic and modern London, but also developed independence, confidence, and a deeper appreciation for the world around them. Their eyes were opened to the possibilities beyond the classroom, making this a day they will remember for a lifetime.



Relationships & Sex Education

Our Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) curriculum is designed to equip children with the essential knowledge, understanding, and skills needed to navigate relationships safely and respectfully, both in the real world and online.

Beginning with learning about family, friendships, and kindness, the curriculum gradually develops to include puberty, reproduction, and key health topics in Year 6.



We use the Christopher Winters Project to deliver engaging and interactive lessons, ensuring that all learning is age-appropriate and sensitively taught.

Stay Safe This Summer

Whether you're staying at home or going away on holiday this summer, please take care to stay safe in and around water.

What to do if you see someone in trouble:

Shout – "Are you in trouble? Can you swim towards me or stand up?"

Reach – Find a long object you can hold out to help them reach safety. Lie down or crouch to avoid being pulled in.

Throw – Throw something that will help them float, such as a throwline, football, or life ring.

Don't go – Never enter the water yourself. Keep your eyes on the person and call 999 immediately.



If you're in trouble: Float to Live

Lie on your back, keep your mouth above the surface, and try to move gently towards safety. Stay as calm as possible.
