

# Summer Newsletter 2026

Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back. I hope you all had a lovely Easter holiday and were able to enjoy some special time with your child. We have a busy and enjoyable summer term ahead!

In Maths, we will be focusing on fractions, time, money, shape and statistics. Regular practice at home will continue to be very helpful for supporting your child's progress. In English, we will be developing writing skills through creating dialogue and retelling stories.

In History this term, we will be learning about the Romans. In Geography, we will be exploring where our food comes from, and in Science, our topic will be plants, which will include a range of practical activities.

Daily routines:

The school day begins at 8:50am, and children will enter through the Year 3 KS2 door. Please encourage your child to arrive on time, as this allows us to make the best use of the morning. Children will also be dismissed from the Year 3 KS2 door at 3:20pm.

Children should bring a water bottle containing water only each day. There is no need for a pencil case, as all necessary stationery will be provided.

P.E.

Our timetabled PE day is Thursday. Lessons may be indoors or outdoors, so please ensure children have appropriate PE kit. We will also be taking part in weekly sessions with a

company called Thrive, focusing on wellbeing, resilience and teamwork. These sessions will take place on Wednesdays, so children will also need their PE kit in school on this day. Lockers will be available should they wish to keep their kit in school. A full kit list can be found on the school website.

### Homework

Homework will continue in the same format as last term.

Children will receive:

- Spelling words on a Friday, to be tested the following Friday
- Maths homework on a Friday via Mathletics, due the following Friday
- A reading comprehension/Problem solving task given on a Friday and due the following Friday

Homework will be recorded in homework books and brought in on Fridays. New homework will be stuck into homework books and shared on SeeSaw. If your child has any difficulties, they are welcome to speak to me and I will be happy to help.

Each pupil has a reading book they can change within the classroom. Please continue to read regularly with your child at home. If you would like any book recommendations, please do let me know.
