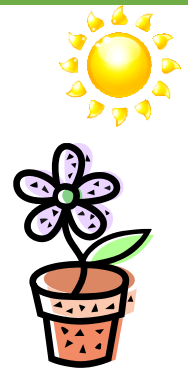


# Welcome Back Year 5

Welcome back to school and the new term. We hope you have had a lovely Easter. This is just a reminder about a few things and to tell you about what has been planned for your child for the final term of Year 5.

## English

In English, we will use the text - Kensuke's Kingdom - to follow Michael's route around the world and base our work on his experiences. We will be writing descriptively about events that occur on his journey, a persuasive advert, a balanced argument, a letter plus a diary entry.



In our reading sessions, the children will be encouraged to read a wide range of texts to continue improving their fluency and comprehension. We would be grateful if you would continue reading with your child for enjoyment and to ensure they are reading with understanding and fluency.

## Maths

In maths, mental recall is vitally important if children are going to make good progress. Using the internet, games or board games can help reinforce the maths needed for Year 5 in a fun and enjoyable way. Your child is familiar with Times Table Rockstars and will have their own username and password for the site. Other super websites are 'Hit the Button', and 'Mathletics'. This term, we will be learning about properties of shape, position and direction, negative numbers, converting units of measurement and volume. ### Topics

Our history topic this term will be *Ancient Greece* and we will explore the following: how we know so much about the *Ancient Greeks*; what pottery remains tell us about everyday life in *Ancient Greece*; why *Ancient Greece* was able to be so strong; whether we would prefer to live in Athens or Sparta; what their interest in the theatre and festivals like The Olympics tell us about the *Ancient Greeks*; and how the *Ancient Greeks* have influenced our lives today. In our geography topic will focus on how we use our oceans. We will learn about what the *Great Barrier Reef* is; why our oceans are suffering; what we can do to help our oceans; and how littered our marine environment is.



### PE

Our PE lessons for the term will be on a Tuesday and Wednesday. Our aim is for PE sessions to take place outside as much as possible so please ensure that your child has suitable clothing so a waterproof coat or sun hat would be beneficial depending on the weather. We would be grateful if you could make sure that long hair is tied back and that earrings are removed or covered with micro-pore or similar on PE days.

### Practical information

The school doors open at 8:50 and the register is taken at 9 am promptly. As the register is completed electronically, should your child arrive at school after 9 am, they must enter via the office so that they can be recorded on both the attendance and lunch register. School finishes at 3:20 pm.

It is important for children to drink water throughout the day especially now the weather is becoming warmer. Recently, we have noticed quite a number of children needing to borrow water bottles from school. Whilst we understand that bottles are sometimes forgotten, can we please ask that your child brings in their own water bottle each day with a secure lid. This minimises the disruption to learning time as children are not having to go and seek water bottles from office staff.

Please try to make sure that all your child's clothes are clearly labelled with their name. It's during this time of year, when jumpers are taken off, that they

are lost or misplaced! Any lost property can then be easily identified.

## Homework



A few reminders about homework. Maths homework will continue to be set on Mathematics every week. Your child also has access to extra work in their student area should they wish to complete more tasks. Reading homework is given out weekly as comprehension questions. The children also have a banded book that they can take home to read. Although children in Year 5 are encouraged to read independently, we would urge you to continue listening to your child read whenever possible as fluency is an essential part of reading and helps comprehension. Asking your child about what they have read also helps you to know whether they have understood the text. Weekly spellings for the term are on our class webpage on our school website under 'Classes' and 'Year 5', plus, the children will be given a hard copy. The spelling sheet shows all spellings for each half term and has a date at the top of each column to let you know when each set is being tested. During the spring term, we noticed a significant reduction in homework being completed by the children. While we understand that on occasions, it may be difficult to complete all tasks, could we please ask you to remind your child of what has been set for each week.
