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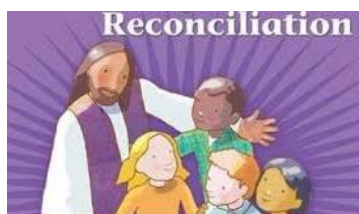

MENTAL HEALTH WEEK

We will be celebrating Children's Mental Health Week from 9-13 February.

To mark the week, children are invited to wear a yellow accessory on Friday 13 February, such as a hairband, badge, bracelet or socks, for a £1 donation. Please log into [ParentPay](#) to take you to this payment item.

This year's theme, "This is My Place," links closely to children's rights, including feeling safe, included, listened to and respected. These ideas connect to the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child (Articles 12, 19, 23 and 28). As a Rights Respecting Gold School, we will be exploring how looking after our mental health is both a right and a responsibility.

Throughout the week, teachers will talk with children about how to care for their mental health as well as their physical health. Our Wellbeing Champions will also be creating Hello Yellow posters and sharing presentations with their peers.

All classes will take part in a debate session, giving pupils the opportunity to practise speaking and listening skills while exploring British Values. These sessions will focus on listening respectfully, valuing different opinions, expressing ideas safely and following agreed rules.

Debate topics by year group are as follows:



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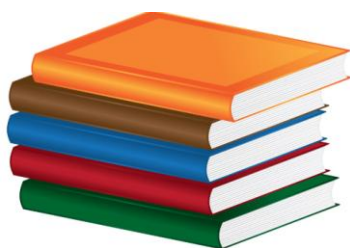


- Reception: Was Jack right to climb the beanstalk?
- Year 1: Should fidget spinners be allowed in school?
- Year 2: Should Hermione have a limit on items in her bag?
- Year 3: Are you for or against deforestation in the Amazon?
- Year 4: Should we use plastic in daily life?
- Year 5: Should mobile phones be banned from schools?
- Year 6: Are zoos cruel?

If your child would like to research their debate topic beforehand, they are very welcome to do so.
