We welcomed guest speakers into school to discuss how they use AI in their work and enjoyed a game of 'Okay or not okay' with some scenarios. Every child completed a bookmark to remind them about smart choices when using AI.

- Talk about how AI sometimes makes mistakes
- Encourage them to check with an adult if something online doesn't feel right
- Remind them not to share personal information with AI tools
