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Science:

This term Year I will be exploring animals! Children will name a variety common animals and sort these into categories. Children will also identify common carnivores. herbivores and omnivores and describe their structures. Children will learn about the human body. labelling parts and also identifying the parts linked to the 5 senses.

English

We will beginning Pathways to Write. in Spring 2. Our book is The Curious Case of the Missing Mammot.h. This provides us with lots of shorter writes including animal descriptions, a diary entry and wanted poster before we create our own adventure story adapting the character and some events.

The mastery focus for this half term:

- € Join words and clauses using and
- ₱ Punctuate sentences using a capital letter and a full stop, question mark or
- 🖴 Add suffixes where no change is needed to the root word e.g. -ed, -ing, -er, -est

Maths

What we are covering this half term:

- Word problems; to decide whether addition or subtraction is the most appropriate operation; to be able to use and apply number bonds and visual representations to solve word problems; to use pictorial representations to help solve word
- Multiplication; to learn the foundations of equal groupings, repeated addition, arrays and doubling, to apply that knowledge to solve word problems
- Division: placing a predetermined number into groups to determine how many groups there will be. After this, pupils will be be given a number of items, but will need to figure out how many will go into each group by sharing equally.

We will continue developing our understanding of pitch, pulse and tempo as we learn a new song Walking Through the Jungle. Towards the end of the half term, we will be using animal themed word cards to create our own compositions, clapping (or using untuned instruments) the syllables. We will also invent our own music symbols to represent actions on each of the instruments and then follow these when performing to peers.

When doing this, they will demonstrate the following skills; to create, name, save and retrieve content, with some support; begin to use a range of media including photos, text and sound; sort, collate and edit simple
