English

Reading

- Focus on establishing a Love of Reading
- Both word reading and comprehension.
- Read aloud sessions every day after lunch

Writing

- Range of genres, both fiction and non-fiction across the year.
- Focus on creativity and exciting writing.
- Consistently applying capital letters, full stops and finger spaces

Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling

- Taught both discretely and during English lessons.
- List of Y1/Y2 spellings displayed on class page of the website.

Handwriting to be cursive

Reading Expectations

- Pathways to Read
- Whole Class Guided Reading
- Continue with phonic development and application learnt
- Recognise words automatically
- Read aloud with greater fluency, using punctuation marks
- Re-tell stories and poems
- Make predictions
- Recognise fiction/non-fiction
- Children will be listened to read weekly
- Books will be changed weekly (have reading records and books in school every day please)



Moving on from Phonics

- Those that still require Phonics will continue to access the ELS programme.
- Regular retrieval of phonics
- Transition to Spellings
- ELS Spelling
- Spelling homework each week- largely based on harder to read and spell words or spelling families

Maths

- Count, read and write numbers to 100
- Know 10 more /10 less of a given number to 100
- Count in steps of 2,3,5 and 10
- Recall and use multiplication facts for 2,5,10
- ► Tell the time o'clock, half past, quarter to/past
- Use different coins to make the same amount

- ► Times tables up to 12x12 at a good pace of recall should be known by the end of Year 4.
 - Year 2 focus on 2, 5 and 10.

Teacher Assessments

- Ongoing throughout the year to build up a picture of your child's achievement and progress through:
 - Formal tests
 - Comprehensions,
 - Dictated sentences
 - Marking, observation and feedback.
 - Discussion and questioning
 - As well as us assessing the children, we encourage them to assess themselves, reflect and evaluate on their own learning.
 - Year 2 NTS papers

Homework

KS1 Weekly expectation:

Reading and mental maths practise.

Reading at least 4 times a week

Reading records – please sign and comment in the reading record for any reading.

- Mental Maths: Practise of mental maths skills, times tables, doubling, halving etc.
- Spelling activity.
- Home work tasks will be set on See-Saw every Thursday (not on the website). Physical Homework books will be handed out on a Thursday to record the tasks and collected in on a Tuesday. Please maintain these books to show high expectation at home and at school.

- Read, read, read (great list of recommended reads on the Year 2 class page, including first chapter books)
- Support with homework and spelling activities, revisit spellings over the week.
- Practice letter and number formation to 100.
- Encourage both effort and positive attitude
- Talk about your child's learning use the curriculum overview and seesaw as a guide.
- Encourage your child to be independent taking responsibility for own property, their own behaviour and their own attitude to learning
- Let us know of any significant changes.
- Order lunches at home (via school gateway) and let your child know what they are having.
