In the news this week



Bikeability Year 5

Year 5 had a great time at Bikeability this week. They learnt how to conduct bike checks so their bike is safe to ride. As well as learning bike positions on the road, the children practised signalling, turning and manoeuvring. These skills are particularly useful as, after the age of 10, cyclists are not permitted to use the pavements.



Car Park and Parking

If you are dropping your child off for Club Rock we request that you follow our procedures for keeping the children safe. If you are using the car park you must reverse into the car park space, as this is a pedestrian access to our school and observe the maximum 5 miles per hour speed limit.

To confirm, the gate to the staff car park will be closed every day at 8.30am and will be opened again at 8.55am. Parents and carers should not lift their children over any gate or fences to access the school grounds.

When parking in the village car park we can not stress enough that cars should only be parked in designated car park spaces and not on the curbs or pavements. We are trying to keep your children safe.

We will be using the context of a rogue dog that has gained access to the school site and could be in the building so we are going to make ourselves safe. Staff will then use the experience to consider what worked well and what can be improved upon.
