Preparing Our Children for the Digital Future

As part of **Internet Safety Day 2026**, our school came together for a **whole-school assembly** focused on the importance of staying safe online and using technology including **Artificial Intelligence (AI) respectfully, responsibly, and thoughtfully**.

The online world is a huge part of children's lives, both now and in the future. From games and videos to learning tools and AI-powered apps, children are growing up in a digital age that is constantly changing. Our aim is not to scare them, but to **equip them with the knowledge, skills, and confidence** they need to make safe and sensible choices online.

Learning Together as a School Community: During our assembly, pupils explored:

- What it means to be **safe online**
- How to **pause and think** before clicking, sharing, or responding
- Why kindness, honesty, and respect matter just as much online as they do offline

How AI can be helpful — but also why it must be used **carefully and responsibly**

We talked openly about the fact that AI is becoming part of everyday life. Rather than avoiding it, we want children to understand it, question it, and use it in positive and safe ways.
