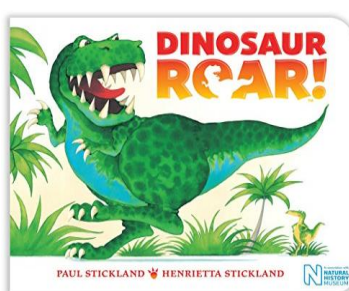

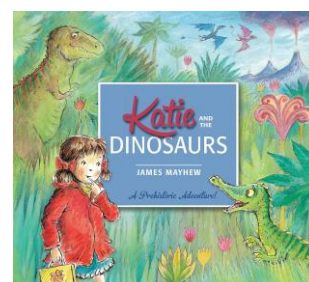

In Literacy, we will be:

Reading: • Read simple phrases and sentences made up of words with known lettersound correspondences and, where necessary, a few exception words • Read a few common exception words matched to the school's phonic programme • Re-read these books to build up their confidence in word reading, their fluency and their understanding and enjoyment

Writing: Form lower-case and capital letters correctly • Write short sentences with words with known sound-letter correspondences using a capital letter and full stop • Re-read what they have written to check that it makes sense

Managing self

understand class rules and remember them without prompts
Develop a sense of responsibility through different monitor roles in the classroom
Help children to set own goals and achieve them
Embed routines such as washing hands, snack time, lunchtime
undress and dress themselves before and after PE and when dressing up
support children to become resilient and persevere in the face of challenges
Show confidence to try new activities
Show independence through activities
Children to reflect and self evaluate their own work

Building relationships

Explain why we take turns, wait politely and tidy up after ourselves
Opportunities to develop friendships through show and tell, group games and discussions
Daily opportunities to spend time with buddies
Show more confidence in new social situations.
