Friendship

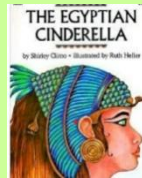

We will be exploring Habitats, Deforestation, Digestive system & Food chains



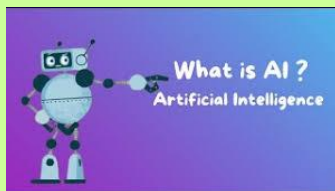
Geography

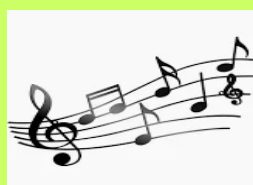
