During the spring we ran the extremely popular Easter Bingo. There was a small easter raffle, a bar and food were served during the event. We had many families attending, and it was a fun social evening wit lots of chocolate taken home!

The summer term is always a busy time in school. The TSA provided refreshments at the KS2 productions, booked another clothes recycle, held a BBQ for the year 6 leavers, and organised the summer BBQ and fair after sports day. Following the success of the previous year's £10 challenge for the year 6's this was once again repeated at the fair. The children's ideas were pitched to the committee, and they prepared their stalls which resulted in a great variety of stalls from games to refreshments and jewellery. The stalls raise an incredible amount and the children's business skills were really impressive. This

year, following a request from Mrs Mort all monies raised from the event were to go towards providing another year of our door learning session throughout the school for all year groups, and we were incredibly pleased to reach the target and secure the funding to be able to continue this valuable provision.

5] Treasurer's Report –

Tilston School Association Treasurer's Report

September 2024 – August 2025

Introduction

This report has been prepared by Sue Clarke, who joined the TSA in July 2025, taking on the role of Treasurer in September 2025, succeeding Helen Young at the end of the 2024/2025 academic year.

Opening Balance

The TSA began the year with a healthy balance of £15,385.

Fundraising Activities

Throughout the year, the TSA organised several fundraising events, raising a total of £6,663 after expenses. The summer fair was the most successful, generating £2,584. Other notable events included Easter Bingo, the Key Stage 2 production bar and raffle, and the Christmas raffle, each raising c.£900, c.£800 and c.£700 respectively.

We are especially grateful to Mr Gerrard (Jake's Dad), who raised £1,427 by cycling from Geneva to Nice. These funds are ringfenced for new sporting equipment and activities for the school. The School Lottery contributed £760, though profits are declining annually. A marketing push may be needed to boost participation.

Expenditure

The TSA funded £15,241 in facilities and activities for the school, a significant increase from previous years due to the Wellbeing Pod project (£8,800 including fixtures, fittings, and path). We hope this investment benefits the whole school for years to come.

Additional funding supported outdoor exploring provision, PE planning, diversity workshops, coach costs and EYFS entertainment for Christmas events, and Year 6 leavers' celebrations.

Closing Balance and Commitments

At year-end, the TSA held £10,122, with £4,947 in promises to pay carried over to the new academic year (including the ringfenced sporting equipment funds). A buffer of £1,500 is maintained for SEND assessments and the financial support fund, leaving £3,675 available for spending in 2025/2026.
