Please ensure your child/ren attends school every day, unless they are too poorly to do so. Punctuality is equally important:

Arriving 5 minutes late every day adds up to over 3 days lost each year = 20 lessons missed. Arriving 15 minutes late every day adds up to 2 weeks absence a year = 55 lessons missed. Arriving 25 minutes late every adds up to 19 days absence a year = 123 lessons missed
