Guidance from Public Health

In recent weeks we have seen a rise in cases of respiratory infections across the North West, leading to increased absences and outbreaks in schools and other community settings. The UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) has reported increasing influenza activity particularly among children and young adults.

We would like to remind everyone that simple measures can minimise the spread of infections. Education settings can play an important role in helping to keep children and staff healthy, supporting healthy learning environments and regular school attendance. Such measures include:

1. Vaccination for protection – free flu vaccinations are available free to all children in England via the School Aged Immunisation Services for school aged children, and also via GP and Pharmacies, further information here [Children's flu vaccine - NHS](#)
2. Hand and respiratory hygiene – hand and respiratory hygiene are a powerful tool to prevent the spread of germs, further information here [hand hygiene](#)
3. Cleaning the environment – particularly high touch areas like door handle, desks and toilets, further information here [cleaning](#)
4. Ventilation - good ventilation can help prevent the spread of respiratory infections, further information here [ventilation](#)
5. Behaviour reminders – remind parents and staff that people with symptoms of respiratory infection who are unwell with a high temperature should stay at home until the fever has gone and they feel better.
People with vomiting and diarrhoea can return 48 hours after the symptoms have stopped if they are feeling well. Further information here [exclusion](#)

Headlice

Head lice and nits are very common in young children and their families. They are not caused by dirty hair and are picked up by head to head contact. Treat head lice as soon as you spot them. You can treat head lice without seeing a GP. Check everyone you live with, or have close contact with, and start treating anyone who has head lice on the same day. You can buy a special fine-toothed comb (detection comb) online or from pharmacies to check for and to remove head lice and nits.
