Water safety

In this hot weather we have been asked to remind you all about water safety.

The RNLI's 2026 Float to Live campaign.

As we move towards the school holidays and any more heat waves, we're asking for your help to share this lifesaving advice to save more lives. It only takes one conversation to save a life, so please share our campaign with your teams, contacts, families and friends – you could be a lifesaver!

A few key campaign snippets to help:

- The core campaign message remains simple and practical: if you find yourself struggling in the water, Float to Live. Tilt your head back with your ears submerged, relax and try to control your breathing, move your hands and legs if needed, and remember that it's OK if your legs sink — we all float differently. Once your breathing is under control, call for help or swim to safety.
- The campaign toolkit includes social media assets, films, posters, pocket guides, email banners and community resources. Please signpost your teams and partners to [download the campaign toolkit here](#), with all the digital assets available on the [Float To Live website here](#).

What's happening in our local libraries this summer:
