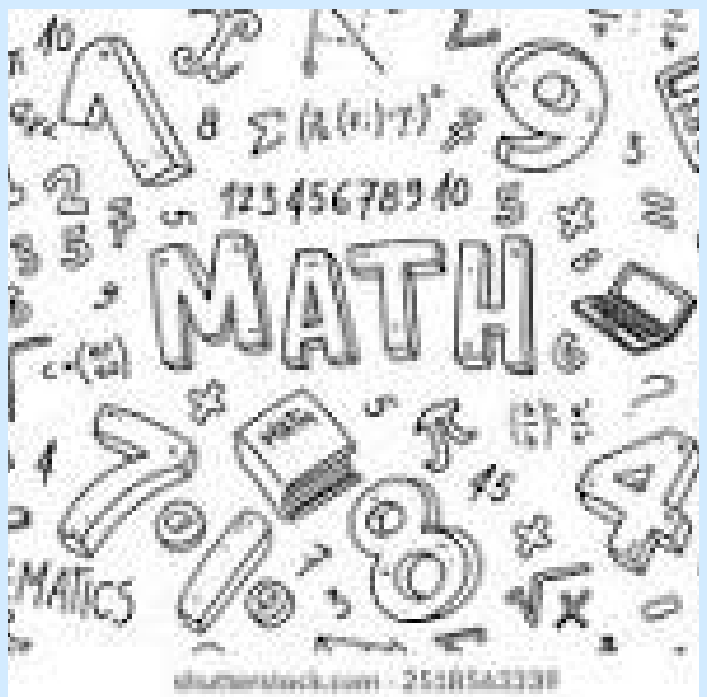

# Curriculum Focus: Science

Our science curriculum is designed to nurture children's curiosity, develop their understanding of the world, and empower them to think scientifically. We aim to provide a rich, coherent programme of learning that builds knowledge progressively, enables secure understanding of key scientific concepts, and equips pupils with the skills needed to work scientifically with increasing independence.


This term our Reception children are observing seasonal changes, Wrens are looking at 'Animals, including humans, Barn Owls are investigating food chains, teeth and the digestive system whilst Falcons are learning about living things, classification and life cycles.
