Buddies

An important part of our school offer is the wraparound care that we have – Buddies.

Our provision for this has always been subsidised by the school budget to keep it affordable. As costs have risen across all aspects of the school, we have had to re-asses this part of our budget. As a result, we will need to increase our prices from January 2026. From January 5th ...

Morning session 7.30 – 8.45 £8.00

After school session – collect any time up to 5.30pm £12.00

We will no longer offer a discounted early pick up price, just the one cost for a place in Buddies. You may continue to collect at any time up to 5.30pm.

Staff will remain on site until 6.00pm in a cleaning role for the school so we request collection anytime before 5.30pm

Attendance

Since September our whole school attendance is 95.1% - we aim for 95%. We have 28 pupils have an attendance at this level. A further 10 pupils have attendance above 90%. 2 pupils are just below with an attendance of 85-89%.

Curriculum Focus: spelling

The Importance of Spelling in Primary School

Spelling plays a key role in a child's early education. Learning to spell helps children read more confidently, write more clearly, and express their ideas with accuracy. When children know how to spell words correctly, they can focus on what they want to say rather than worrying about how to write it. At KSJ we use Pathways to Write alongside our Twinkl phonics program in KS1 to develop the children's knowledge of spelling patterns and rules.

Strong spelling skills also support:

- Reading development – recognising spelling patterns helps children decode new words
- Writing confidence – children are more willing to write when spelling feels manageable
- Academic success – spelling underpins all subjects, from English to science and history

Developing good spelling habits in primary school lays the foundation for lifelong literacy.

How Parents Can Help at Home

Parents play an important role in supporting spelling development. Simple, regular activities can make a big difference:

- Read together daily – seeing words in context helps children remember spelling patterns
- Practise spelling little and often – short, frequent practice is more effective than long sessions
- Talk about words – discuss tricky words, word meanings, and how words are built
- Make it fun – use games, magnetic letters, word searches, or spelling apps
- Encourage writing – shopping lists, cards, notes, and short stories all help reinforce spelling
- Praise effort, not just accuracy – confidence grows when children feel supported

By working together, school and home can help children become confident, capable spellers who enjoy reading and writing.
