## **Christian values for spring 2: Forgiveness and Compassion**

Ephesians 4:32 (ESV) instructs, "Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you." It serves as a practical call to replace bitterness with compassion and to extend free forgiveness just as Christ did for believers, highlighting that Christian unity and relationships are maintained through grace.

Actionable Kindness: The verse moves beyond just avoiding harm; it commands proactive kindness and compassion (tenderheartedness) in relationships.

### **Healthy Eating**

We recently sent home a letter asking for your support in providing healthy lunchbox choices for your child. Our approach follows the UK Government's School Food Standards and Early Years nutrition guidance, which encourage balanced meals and the development of healthy eating habits from a young age

A healthy lunchbox should ideally include:

- A starchy food – such as wholegrain bread, wraps, pasta, rice, or crackers
- A source of protein – for example chicken, tuna, eggs, hummus, beans, or cheese
- At least one portion of fruit or vegetables – such as apple slices, grapes, carrots, cucumber, or cherry tomatoes
- A dairy food or dairy alternative – such as yoghurt or cheese
- A drink – water or milk is recommended

To promote healthy lifestyles across the school, we ask that lunchboxes limit foods high in sugar, salt, and saturated fat. Items such as chocolate bars, sweets, fizzy drinks, and large bags of crisps are best kept as occasional treats rather than everyday lunchbox item

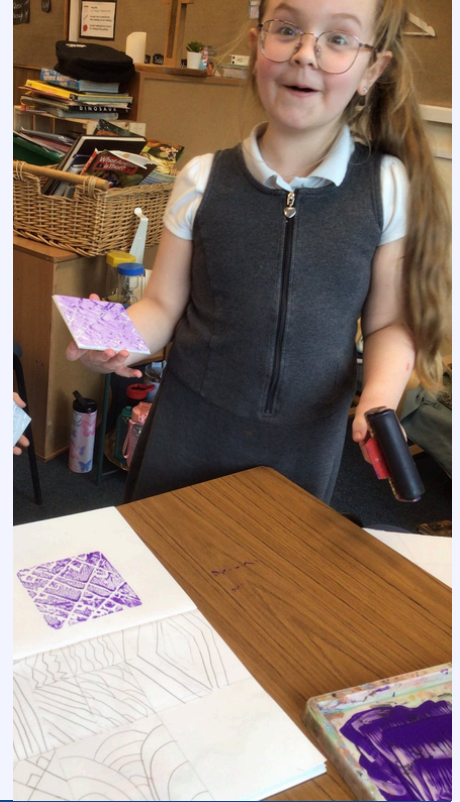
