#### **ENGLISH**



We will begin our term refreshing our knowledge of punctuation and grammar.

Once secure in our knowledge, we will be using the text Winter's Child to develop our use of descriptive writing features. We will draw all of our work together to write our own fantasy stories.

#### RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

We begin our year reflecting on our wonderful world and all of God's creation. Through different ways of knowing we will listen to, reflect on and discuss scripture and images from the Bible, considering how we can look after our world and the wonders within.



After half term, we will begin to dig deeper into the Mass and explore the key parts. We will reflect on the Creation story linking the fruits of Creation with the presentation of the gifts at mass. We will conclude our term by exploring the nativity according to Matthew's gospel.

#### **CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING**

#### **MATHS**

Using a range of equipment, we will consolidate our understanding of 2-digit numbers before moving on to explore 3-digit numbers. We will focus on recognizing the place value of each digit, comparing and ordering numbers, and partitioning them in both standard and non-standard ways.



We will learn to add and subtract 3-digit numbers using a range of methods to build confidence and understanding before moving on to written methods such as column addition and subtraction. We will also practise mental strategies, such as rounding and adjusting or using number bonds to help us calculate quickly. Alongside this, we will solve word problems and real-life maths challenges to help us understand when and how to use these methods effectively.

In Year 3, we will consolidate our recall of 2, 5 and

10 times tables as well as becoming fluent in our 3, 4 and 8s. Log on to TTRS to keep practicing!



#### SCIENCE



Animals including Humans We will be investigating:

- Are all animals the same?
- What would happen if we only ate bananas?
- Can a hamburger be healthier than a salad?
- · What if our bones were made of ielly?
- · Do all animals have a skeleton?

#### **GEOGRAPHY**


During the first half term we will be studying the British Coasts and considering the question; Why is the coast a special place? We will:
