Headteacher's Notes

Dear parents and carers,

As I step into the role of Interim Headteacher for the spring term, I want to share how proud I am to continue serving our school in this capacity. Having worked in our wonderful school for many years, it is a privilege to take on this role. I would also like to give thanks for the warm words many of you have shared. I'm looking forward to working closely with you to make this a positive and successful term for all our children.

Although it has only been a four-day week in school, it has certainly been a busy one. We have faced a few challenges, including freezing temperatures, snow, and even a power cut! Despite the wintery weather, lessons have continued as usual, and the children have quickly settled back into school life.
