Headteacher's Notes

Dear Parents and Carers,

It is hard to believe that we are already halfway through this half-term - time really does fly when school life is so full and busy!

This week, I have thoroughly enjoyed visiting each class and spending time observing reading and writing lessons. Inspired by a range of engaging texts, it has been wonderful to see the children exploring fiction, non-fiction and poetry with such enthusiasm. Reading remains a vital part of our curriculum and underpins success across all subjects. We kindly encourage you to continue supporting your child at home by reading together at least four times each week.

On Tuesday, as part of our PSHE curriculum, children took part in class assemblies resourced by Pol-Ed (Police Education). These sessions, recently introduced across St Helens schools, are designed to strengthen children's understanding, build resilience and encourage them to support one another. This week's themes included online safety, making positive choices, understanding emotions and preparing Year 6 for their transition to Year 7.

As a gentle reminder, we are proud to be a healthy school.
