Headteacher's Notes

Dear Parents and Carers,

As we reach the end of another busy week, I would like to begin by saying how incredibly proud we have been of all our children. The warm weather has certainly been a challenge, but they have managed remarkably well in the heat. Thank you to all families for ensuring children arrived at school with water bottles, hats and suitable clothing throughout the week.

Last Saturday, we were delighted to be part of the Sutton Park Family Fun Day. A huge thank you to Mrs Weeks, Miss Preston and Ms Birchall (Poppy's mum) for volunteering their time to run the PTFA stand. Thanks to their efforts, £129 was raised for our school.

Congratulations also to our Year 5 and Year 6 football team, who represented the school brilliantly in the Sutton Shield tournament, finishing in a fantastic second place. A special thank you goes to Mr Owolabi (Reinhard's dad) for volunteering to support the team throughout the day. He described the children as 'spot on', praising them for being respectful, following instructions and showing kindness and friendliness throughout the tournament. They were wonderful ambassadors for our school and should be incredibly proud of themselves.

The school week began with our annual Sports Day. A huge thank you to Mr Brown for organising such a successful event, and to all the parents and carers who came along to cheer on the children. It was wonderful to see everyone enjoying the running, jumping and throwing events - and that even included some of our parents and carers! Congratulations to everyone for demonstrating determination, resilience and excellent sportsmanship throughout the event.

The results were incredibly close, with Green Team finishing in first place on 604 points, followed by Yellow Team on 593 points, Red Team on 588 points and Blue Team on 576 points. Congratulations to Green Team, who will receive a well-deserved prize next week.

On Tuesday, our Year 6 pupils took part in an engaging workshop delivered by the Liverpool City Region Combined Authority to help prepare them for travelling independently to secondary school. They learned about the upcoming changes to bus services, the benefits of using public transport, how to plan journeys, expected behaviour whilst travelling and how to stay safe when using buses. The children asked thoughtful questions and gained valuable knowledge that will support them as they prepare for this exciting next chapter.

On Wednesday, our Reception children enjoyed a wonderful trip to Knowsley Safari Park. They experienced the safari from the comfort of an air-conditioned coach before watching both the sea lion show and the impressive birds of prey display. The children had a fantastic day and thoroughly enjoyed the experience. Thank you to our staff and parent volunteers for helping to make the visit such a success.

This week, one of our assemblies focused on staying safe in the sun. The children discussed why too much exposure to the sun can be harmful and learned simple ways to protect themselves, including wearing sunscreen, hats and suitable clothing, staying in the shade during the hottest part of the day and drinking plenty of water.

Parents and carers are very welcome to come along to speak with the School Nurse, who can offer advice and support on a range of topics including health screenings, children's emotional wellbeing, healthy lifestyles and puberty.
