#### Learning Environment

St Peter's Church of England Primary School is a well-respected two form entry school situated in Rochdale. We cater for 472 pupils from Nursery to Year 6 (3 – 11 years old). We are lucky to be positioned on a large plot overlooking the Pennine hills. Our school has recently undergone a major renovation and building project, further enhancing our school with new learning spaces such as our woodland walk, computer suite and library. This ongoing development of our buildings, and outdoor spaces, has not only helped us to maximise access to a rich curriculum, but provided a truly unique learning environment we are truly proud of.

## Behaviour

We are extremely proud of the outstanding behaviour at our school. It is our primary aim that every member of our school community feels valued and respected, and that each person is treated fairly. We are a caring community, built on mutual trust and respect for all, encompassing our core Christian values so all members of our school can live and work together, promoting an environment where everyone feels happy and safe.

We praise good behaviour, as this further develops our ethos of kindness and cooperation. We operate a House System where each child is in assigned to a particular patron saint, St George, St Andrew, St Patrick, and St David. Children are awarded house points for good work, manners, behaviour and kindness.

Each week children's work and achievements are celebrated during our Good News Assembly. Each teacher names those children who have worked or behaved particularly well, and selects one child for special recognition to receive a special certificate.

Pupils at St Peter's are happy, hardworking and well-mannered and everyone is valued as an individual with an important contribution to make. Occurrences of poor behaviour are extremely rare. If they do occur they are always dealt with swiftly and effectively.

We are very proud of the smart appearance of our children. Uniform gives us a sense of belonging and being part of the wider family of St Peter's. We ask parents to ensure that children come to and from school in their full uniform every day. Our uniform and PE kit list, is available on our website including details about our uniform suppliers.


