I shared with you a summary of our brilliant primary school results in the July newsletter, our two secondary schools enjoyed some fantastic GCSE, BTEC and A level results in the summer. Key Stage 4 and Key Stage 5 2025 results at both Alsager School and Brine Leas, were well above regional and national figures in all areas.

Congratulations to all the young people who achieved such brilliant results and many thanks for the invaluable support from parents, carers and families. A special thank you to every member of staff in both schools, all of whom helped to contribute to such a superb set of results.

These headline figures clearly indicate that we are a high achieving and successful trust when it comes to pupil outcomes. There is much more detail on performance data on each individual school's websites.

However, as with any successful organisation, we are always looking at how we can improve, raise standards even further, better support our young people, families and develop our staff. For these reasons, we have recently appointed Mrs Walker as Executive SENCO to work across our schools to see how we can best support some of our most vulnerable young people. We have sourced additional support for our schools in the areas of dyslexia and support with attendance matters. Our two Family Liaison Officers, Mrs Cliffe and Mrs Potts, have also produced a brilliant signposting resource for our families and young people who are looking for local support on a wide range of issues.

Mrs Bentley (Brine Leas) and Mrs Martin (Alsager), have designed a brilliant range of CPD programmes for all our staff, across all our schools. Mrs Woollam and Mrs Harrison (Alsager Highfields), continue to drive our writing framework, high expectations and literacy moderation that takes place across all our primary schools. Mr Barker (Brine Leas), is driving an excellent maths transition project involving staff from all our schools, in an attempt to make that move from primary to secondary as smooth as possible when it comes to maths (as we have done previously with English). We are









of course still running The Cornovii Cup competition between the two secondary schools, Alsager and Brine Leas. In an exciting addition this year, 4 of our primary schools came together to form The Cornovii Choir. They entered the Cheshire Police Carol Competition and met to practice and perform at Pear Tree Primary in Nantwich. Unfortunately, they did not make it through to the final at Chester Cathedral but all the children did brilliantly well.
