A message from Mr Cutts

Over the next two weeks, school really does enter full Christmas mode. Today, Friday 5 December, we begin with the Friends of Weston Christmas Fair straight after school. The hall will be full of games, stalls and festive treats, with our choir performing too — it's always a lovely way to start the countdown.



Next week, the performances begin in earnest. On Monday 8 December, Sparrows will share their nativity in both an afternoon and an evening performance. On Tuesday 9 and Wednesday 10 December, our Year 5 children will be out developing their road safety and cycling confidence through Bikeability, and then Thursday 11 December brings the Robins and Puffins Christmas performance (afternoon and evening), as well as Christmas Jumper Day, when children are invited to add something festive to their school uniform. We round off that week with Christmas dinner day on Friday 12 December, when the whole school sits down to enjoy a traditional festive lunch togethe r.

The following week is just as busy. On Monday 15 December, our EYFS and KS1 children will head out on their Christmas theatre trip, which is always a magical experience. On the evening of Tuesday 16 December, our school choir will be representing Weston at the Shavington Academy Christmas Concert, sharing their singing with families and the wider community. Later in the week, Magpies will lead their class assembly on Thursday 18 December at 10am.

We finish the term in traditional Weston style on **Friday 19 December** with **Weston's Got Talent** – our whole-school celebration where everyone comes together to enjoy KS2 pupils sharing their talents in singing, dancing, comedy, magic and more – before we **break up for Christmas at the end of the day**.

It is a busy time, but it's also one of the most special points in the school year. Thank you in advance for all the support you give with costumes, transport and everything else that helps these events to run smoothly.

Morning arrival and registers – important reminder

We're tightening up our morning register procedures to make sure we always have an accurate picture of who is in school. From Monday 8 December, children will need to be in their classrooms and ready to start the day by 8.45am in order to be 'on time'. This is the official start of the school day and when learning begins.

From 8.45am on the dot, the pupil entry doors and gate will be closed. Any children arriving after this time will be asked to come through the main school entrance and go straight to Mrs Blackburn in the office, where they need to be signed in and their arrival time recorded. We ask that parents accompany children of all ages if they are coming into school after 8.45am so that you can sign them in.

I want to reassure you that coming through the main door and being signed in is not a punishment. We know there are many reasons why families may occasionally be late. This system is simply a vital part of our register and safeguarding procedures — it means we always know exactly who is on site, can follow up any unexplained absences quickly and can account for every child in the event of a fire drill or emergency.

Thank you for your support in helping us keep all children safe and for doing everything you can to ensure they arrive on time. A calm, prompt start at 8.45am makes a real difference to children's confidence, learning and routines.

A Christmas Journey for Puffins

Earlier this week, our Puffins (Year 2) children enjoyed a very special Christmas Journey in school, led by six wonderful volunteers from Englesea Brook Chapel and Museum.

Instead of us travelling to the chapel, Englesea Brook brought the experience to Weston, turning different rooms around school into scenes from the Nativity story. In small groups, the children 'travelled' around

school, meeting characters such as Mary and Joseph, the shepherds, a wise man/wise woman, the innkeeper, a donkey and an angel.

The sessions were interactive and felt a bit like immersive theatre – the children listened, asked questions and joined in as each character shared their part of the story. Afterwards, everyone came back together for Christmas crafts and a festive sweet treat, before ending with a song.

It was a lovely way for Puffins to explore the Christmas story in a calm, thoughtful and memorable way. We're very grateful to the Englesea Brook team for their time and for creating such a special experience for the children.
