# **Welcome to Nursery**

#### **Key Skills**

### **Communication and Language**

Play a simple preposition game with your child. Find a doll or a small teddy and ask your child to put the doll/teddy:

- Under the cushion
- On top of the cushion
- Next to the cushion
- Behind the cushion



Can they tell you where the doll/teddy is?

You can also read a familiar story with your child, asking them to join in with repeated refrains.

### **Key Skills**

#### **Mathematics**

Practice reciting numbers 1 to 10... Can your child count 3 jumps, 3 claps or 3 steps? There are lots of number rhymes to support counting.





Look for things to sort and group in the house or in the garden... Are they the same or different?

### **Understanding the World**



Go for a Welly Walk together... talk about the different things you can see and hear whilst out and about. Practise putting on your own wellies for the walk.

Can you see any familiar minibeasts? Can you hear any birds or cars?

# **Physical Development**

Play a ball game with your child. Can they kick the ball? Can they catch the ball?

You could also play a game of 'Simon Says'. Can you child move in a range of ways:

- Crawling
- Walking
- Running
- Jumping
- Hopping



## **Key Skills**

#### Literacy

Read a picture book with your child. Whilst going through the story pause to ask your child specific questions.

- Who is in the story?
- What is happening?
- What do you think is going to happen next?
- Where are they in the story?

#### **Expressive Arts and Design**

Can your child name one of their favourite songs? Ask them to help you sing it. Can they sing the missing words in the rhyme?



Start to build a bank of nursery rhymes that your child can sing or sign along to. Nursery rhymes are a powerful learning source in early literacy and enable children to become interested in the rhythm and patterns of language
