

Things that you can do to help your child with their maths:



In Year 6, we will be looking at fractions, measure, decimals, algebra and ratio.

It is vital that your child practises their times tables regularly at home. Over recent weeks, we have found that this has been presenting as a barrier for many children.

To help your child with this, encourage them to use TT Rockstars regularly.



In order to help your child further, always encourage them to find patterns and relationships between numbers. If they know that $4 \times 8 = 32$, what else do they know from this?

Your child must bring their copy of The Good Thieves into school everyday, as we will be using them in lessons, as well as encouraging them to read it home.

Please ensure that your child is reading their accelerated reader book so they can quiz regularly. This can be done at home as well as in school.

Things that you can do to help your child with their writing:

- Remind your child to join their handwriting all of the time since this is a Year 6 requirement.
- Practise spellings at least 5 times per week.
- Encourage your child to write a letter to our local MP about how we can take greater care of our local environment.
- Encourage your child to write a report about their life so far and their hopes for the future.
- Write a short play about how modern living is impacting our world.
- Help your child to use a dictionary to find the correct spelling of words they're unsure of.
