Can your child recite the numbers 1-15 forwards and backwards?

Start to point out numbers whilst you are out and about.
Can your child recognise any of the numbers?

Encourage your child to find the matching amount.
They could try to find **6** apples, **6** sticks, **6** leaves, **6** socks...

Explore a variety of vegetables. Which one is your favourite? Can you try a new vegetable? Can your child sort healthy and unhealthy food?

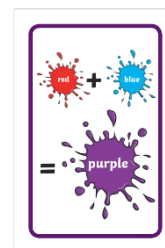
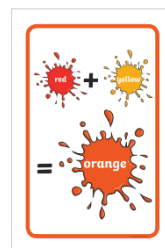
