## Little Red Riding Hood and Little Red and the Very Hungry Lion

### Key Skills: Communication and Language

Listen to your child retell our story 'Little Red Riding Hood.' Help them to draw a story map of the story.



Discuss people who help us and think about what they do to help. Who has helped your child and how? We will also be learning about lions. What is your favourite animal? Why is it your favourite? What does it eat? Share any facts you know about the animal.

### Key Skills

#### Mathematics

This half term, we will continue to work with numbers beyond 10 and will be adding and taking away within 10.

We will then be working on sharing and doubling. Using objects around your house, can you find doubles in your home? You might spot 3 forks and 3 knives. Double 3 is 6!

Roll a dice and build a tower with that number of bricks. Can you now double your tower? How many bricks do you have now?



Can you have a teddy bears picnic and share the food out equally so that each teddy has the same number?

Remember to log on to Numbots to develop your subitising skills and understanding of number bonds.

### Expressive Arts and Design



We will be learning about different superheroes in our local community. Think about the superheroes around you.

Can you design a new vehicle for them?

### Key Skills: Physical Development

Draw a self-portrait of yourself doing something you are really good at. This could be playing sport, dancing, drawing or something you enjoy!

#### Tripod Grip

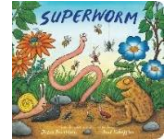


Ensure your child is holding their pencil correctly (see above) and they are forming their letters accurately too.

Challenge- Draw somebody who helps you in the community and write about what they do.

### Key Skills: Literacy

Write a simple thank-you card to someone who has helped you or create a mini book with a drawing of someone who helps you and write a short sentence about what they do. Remember to use a capital letter, finger spaces, and a full stop.



Read a book all about superheroes such as Superworm by Julia Donaldson. Can you think of a different ending?

Please continue to complete RWI homework. Alongside this, spend time promoting a love for reading. Make dens and snuggle inside with a book or share books in unusual places.

### Understanding the World

We have been talking about real life superheroes from our community such as firefighters, police officers, carers, lollipop person etc.

Can you choose one person who helps us and with an adult use an internet search engine to find out more about their job.



Draw a simple map of our local area and label the workplaces of people who help us.

This half term we will be reading stories such as A Superhero Like You, The Three Little Wolves and The Big Bad Pig, What the Ladybird Heard and The Wolf's Story: What Really Happened to Little Red Riding Hood.
