Wanda's Words Got Stuck

Key Skills

Communication and Language

Give your child a job to do. Can they listen carefully to the instruction and carry it out?

Talk about your family and home. Ask your child questions about their family and friends to begin conversations.



Encourage your child to tell you about their school day. What have they enjoyed doing? What have they learnt today?

Key Skills

Mathematics

Sing number rhymes with your child, encouraging them to count forwards and back such as 5 little speckled frogs and 5 little monkeys.



Can your child count 5 objects accurately? You could line up your teddies or toys at home.

Understanding the World

Talk about your favourite things that you and your family like to do at home.

Talk about special occasions such as Birthdays, Halloween, Bonfire Night and other things you celebrate as a family.



Take photographs for tapestry so that your child can share their family celebrations with their peers in school.

Key Skills

Physical Development

Can your child hold a pencil using the correct grip? Encourage your child to hold their pencil using a tripod (snappy) grip. What patterns and shapes can they draw?

Practice cutting skills at home, showing your child how to use a pair of scissors correctly and safely. Can you make snips in the paper? Can you cut along straight and wavy lines?



Key Skills

Literacy

You can help your child develop the skills they need for phonics through every day play and activities. Talk and sing together, share nursery rhymes and stories. Play sound games such as identifying environmental sounds, clapping syllables in words, and finding words that rhymes.

Draw a picture and tell your child the sound it starts with, for example 'b' for boat or 'c' for cat.

Expressive Arts and Design

Can you learn a new rhyme to sing?



Use playdough to create a model. Can your child make a model of themselves? Encourage your child to squash, squeeze, roll, pat and poke the playdough to build up their hand muscles ready for writing.
