
















## <u> Hub 2</u>

In addition to our literacy book, 'School is more than a building', hub 2 have been enjoying looking at some different books this week.














## <u>Hub 3</u>

During our Maths lessons this week, the children have been exploring 2D shapes and their properties. Some children were able to select the correct shape, some children could name each shape and some children were able to identify the shape by thinking about how many sides and corners it had.







## <u> Hub 4</u>

We have been learning about animals and their habitats/homes in both Literacy and Science this week. The children have enjoyed making different shelters using a range of materials and resources both in and outside of the classroom.















## **Nursery**

This week in Nursery, we have been looking at the different seasons. First, we looked at the different seasons in our story Stick Man. Then, we made a list of things to keep Stick Man warm. Then, we discussed Christmas and the celebrations. Finally, we made candy cane patterns as they were part of the Christmas celebrations we discussed.







## **Reception**

This week, the children experienced a fun sensory space adventure. We put on our space suits, space boots and space helmets and got our space tickets ready! The children sang the song 'Rocket in Space' and counted down from 10-0 ready to take off. We talked about what we could see in space such as the different planets and twinkly stars. We enjoyed exploring the sensory equipment in space.









## Year 1

This week in PSHE, we were discussing how families come in many different forms and that our families can be made of people that are special to us. We then drew our special people balloons.







## Year 2

This week in Topic, we went on a microhabitat hunt around school. We worked in partners to create a tally chart and recorded all the different minibeast that we found and the microhabitat that they were living in.

We then used Purple Mash on the iPads to record our data.













## Year 3

This week in science, we had lots of fun experimenting with how shadows are made. We looked at a mixture of objects and discussed why some made clearer shadows than others.









### Year 4

The Baptist church visited our class to deliver a workshop all about Christingles, explaining their meaning and the symbols used in each part. After learning about the tradition, we had the chance to make our own candles to represent Jesus as Light of the World.







#### Year 5

In PSHE, we had a visit from Cheshire Fire and Rescue Service. They came to talk to us about road safety. We learn the different ways pedestrians could cross the road including toucan, pelican, zebra and puffin crossings. We thought about how we can cross safely using the phrase stop, look, listen and think. We also discussed car safety and when we are going on a journey, we should always use seatbelts, which fit snug and sit on a boaster seat if the belt doesn't fit correctly. We also spoke about how accidents can happen when drivers can become distracted. We know it is important to be sensible in the car so that drivers are focused. We finished the session off by talking about bike safety and the importance of wearing a helmet and visible clothing.







## Year 6

We have been busy baking in Year 6 this week! In History, we have been learning about rationing as part of our WW2 topic and in our lesson this week we recreated a war-time classic: The National Loaf. We even made a mixed berry jam to go alongside our bread. The children thoroughly enjoyed baking and eating the bread and have even asked for copies of the recipe to take home!

#### **Maths News**

All children from Reception through to KS2 have access to an app called **Numbots.** This fantastic app supports children with their number fluency, allowing them to use efficient mental calculation strategies to add/subtract, so they don't rely on using their fingers!

If your child is in KS2 they will also have access to an app called **Times Table Rocks Stars (TTRS)**, which supports knowledge of times tables and therefore builds confidence in multiplication and division.

Evidence tells us that logging on for **just a few minutes each day** will make a massive difference to their number fluency/times tables skills.
