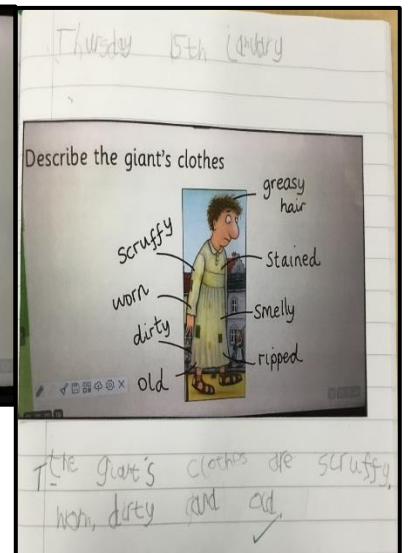
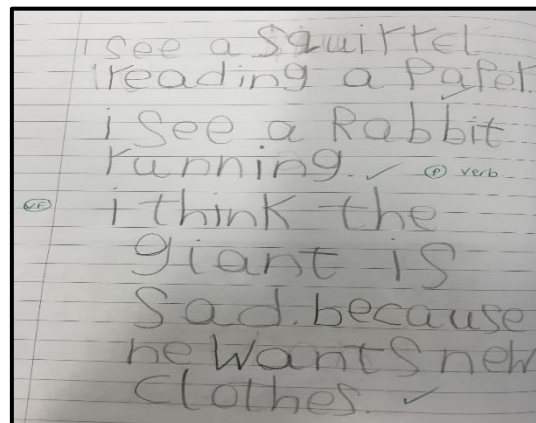
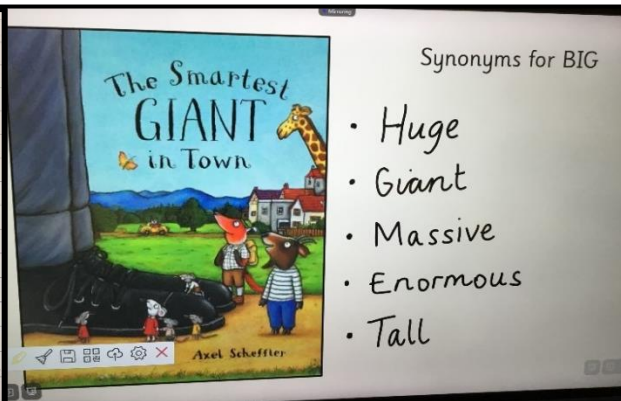
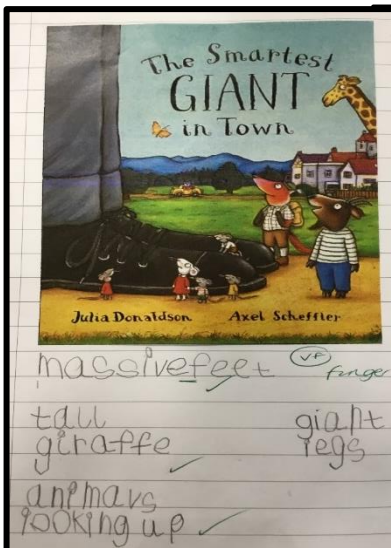
Hub 3

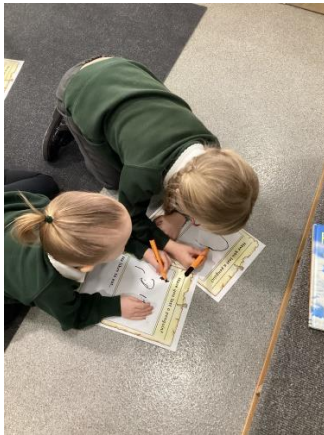
Hub 4

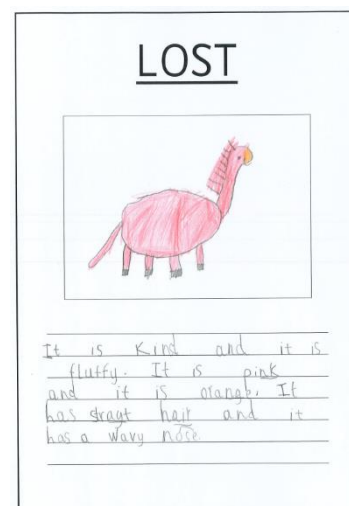
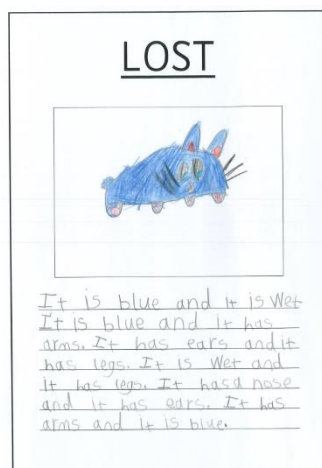
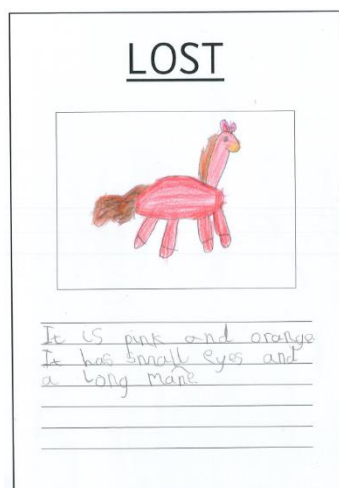
Reception

After noticing bird and wildlife footprints in the snow last week, the children showed curiosity and excitement about the animals that had visited our outdoor area. They decided to help care for the birds by making feeders using slices of fruit. The children carefully threaded string through the fruit, showing good hand-eye coordination and concentration. They worked together to hang the feeders outside, demonstrating kindness, teamwork, and an understanding of how to support living things in their environment.



Year 1

This week we have been reading the story 'Toys in Space' as a clue to our new topic this half term. We explored toys from the story. During the week the toys in our classroom disappeared. We created 'Lost' posters to find them again!



Year 2

Year 4

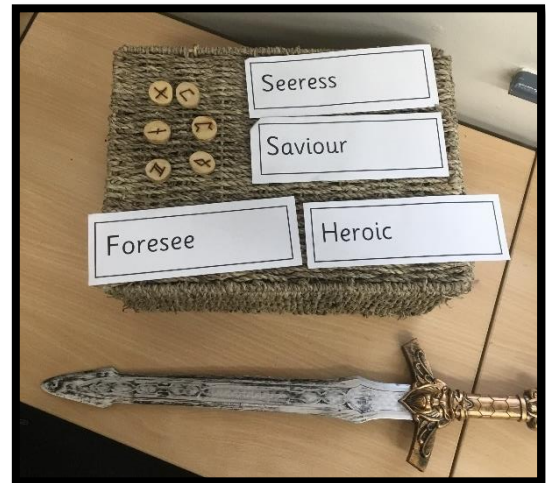

Year 5

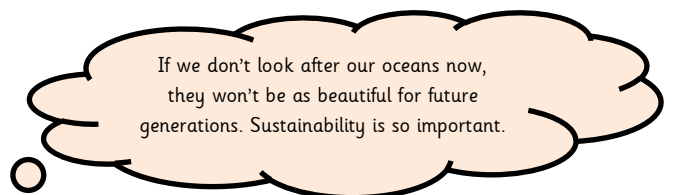
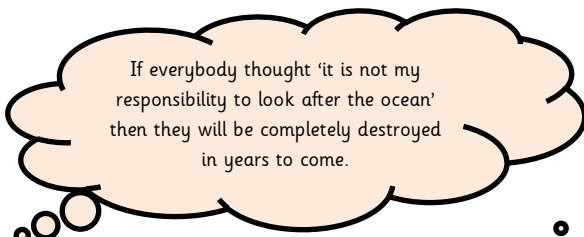

Maths News

All children from Reception through to KS2 have access to an app called **Numbots**. This fantastic app supports children with their number fluency, allowing them to use efficient mental calculation strategies to add/subtract, so they don't rely on using their fingers!

If your child is in KS2 they will also have access to an app called **Times Table Rocks Stars (TTRS)**, which supports knowledge of times tables and therefore builds confidence in multiplication and division.

Evidence tells us that logging on for **just a few minutes each day** will make a massive difference to their number fluency/times tables skills.

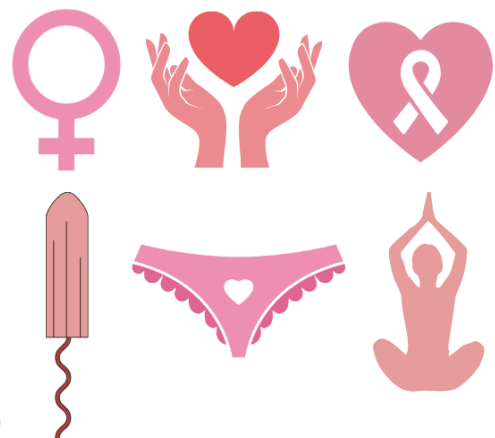
