

This week, we have focused on numbers in maths; we have listened to various songs which count forwards and backwards to and from 10 and had a go at lots of counting related activities.




Hub 3

Hub 4

This week, the children have been learning about 2-D and 3-D shapes. They have been exploring different resources and can identify the different names of many shapes and some of their properties.

Year 1

This week we discovered our new topic is 'Toy Shops'. On Monday we brought in our favourite toy to share with our friends. We discussed why it is our favourite toy and where we got it from. Then, we had a visit from Mrs Dewsbury who shared her favourite toys from the past. Throughout the week we began to compare toy shops from the past to the present.



Year 2

In Literacy this week, the children have continued their immersive narrative writing. We received news that the Reception children had noticed a big gust of wind and a flash of light in their outdoor area. We went to investigate hoping that it could be clues leading to a new species of dragon. The children gathered evidence of the clues and produced a recount of their findings.



Year 3


This week, we have been learning how to code using micro:bits. To begin with, we recapped what an algorithm was and explored what the microbits could do. Then we learnt how to use repeat commands to make the micro:bit write our name and other messages. It was lots of fun!



Year 4

This week we used our classification skills to group leaves together based on their similarities. In our groups we had seven different types of plants. We were not told what the plants were, so we had to look very carefully at the leaves.

We worked in our groups to observe the leaves closely. We looked at their colour, shape, size and texture. Some leaves were smooth, while others felt rough. Some leaves were bright or colourful, and others were different shades of green.




Year 5

In PSHE, we have been thinking about how we can safely use the internet. To begin, we created an opinion line considering the statement: the internet is more harmful than useful for children. We then discussed this as a group considering the reasons for and against this. We created a list of risks and benefits of the internet. We also discussed SMART rules for how to stay safe online.

In Science this week, Simon, from Wings and Things, came to visit us with a variety of animals. Using these creatures, he explained how a small change that a living thing goes through can enable it to become better suited to its environment. Did you know snakes used to have four legs and boas and pythons still have two legs? These adaptations have allowed these animals to evolve and change so that they do not die out.

We saw a Red-Tailed Boa Constrictor, a Barn Owl, Giant African Land Snails, Millipedes and a Siberian Eagle Owl.

We will be using the amazing knowledge we gained from Science to inform our next piece of Literacy writing.

Year 5&6 Dodgeball Festival





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Maths News

All children from Reception through to KS2 have access to an app called **Numbots**. This fantastic app supports children with their number fluency, allowing them to use efficient mental calculation strategies to add/subtract, so they don't rely on using their fingers!

If your child is in KS2 they will also have access to an app called **Times Table Rocks Stars (TTRS)**, which supports knowledge of times tables and therefore builds confidence in multiplication and division.


Evidence tells us that logging on for **just a few minutes each day** will make a massive difference to their number fluency/times tables skills.
