

As we are learning about the different seasons in Science, we have made Summer trees to add to our class display.




Hub 3



Year 3

This week, Year 3 have set up an experiment to investigate how to dehydrate mango. They have put some in a dehydrator and some will be left to air dry. Over the next few days, they will be watching what happens carefully.



Year 4

This week, Year 4 have been working hard on dividing 2-digit and 3-digit numbers. We have focused on efficiently partitioning numbers and carefully thinking about multiples to help us solve problems with confidence. The children have shown great perseverance and are becoming increasingly more confident in their division strategies.



Year 5

In our history lesson, we learnt about Alfred 'the great' king of the Anglo-Saxons. We spoke about how the Viking and Anglo-Saxon periods of history interlink and how the Anglo-Saxons spent many years fighting Viking invaders in England. We learnt all about king Alfred and why he could be considered a great or not-so-great king. We created a class list of our ideas, discussed our thoughts and opinions and finally had a class debate.


Alfred the Great	Alfred the not-so-great

Year 6

In this week's science lesson, the children were given equipment, which represented different types of beaks and different food types.

Using one 'beak' and one 'food' at a time, the children explored how 'beak' shapes affect the 'food' that could be eaten by the finches on the Galapagos Islands. This investigation helped them to understand Darwin's scientific work on evolution.






Picture News

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Maths News

All children from Reception through to KS2 have access to an app called **Numbots**. This fantastic app supports children with their number fluency, allowing them to use efficient mental calculation strategies to add/subtract, so they don't rely on using their fingers!

If your child is in KS2 they will also have access to an app called **Times Table Rocks Stars (TTRS)**, which supports knowledge of times tables and therefore builds confidence in multiplication and division.

Evidence tells us that logging on for **just a few minutes each day** will make a massive difference to their number fluency/times tables skills.
