This half-term in Year 3 we are learning:

English:

Our book this half-term is **'The Mischevians' by William Joyce.** We
will be using this text to inspire the
following:

- An imaginative book blurb to intrigue the reader about a world involving Mischevians.
- A detailed set of instructions to inform Parish School about what methods to follow, in the event of an outbreak.
- A wanted paster based on a Mischevian escaping.
- A detailed nonchronological report based on a Mischevian.

Alongside this, we will be reading lots of books as a class and we will start our daily reading with a text called 'The Bay Who Grew Dragons', by Andy Shepherd.

Each day, we will be continuing to revise Set 2 and 3 Phanics sounds, Year 3 Spellings and cursive/joined handwriting. Please continue to access Spelling Frame.

Maths:

In Maths, we will firstly be continuing with our Measurement unit and we will be learning about Time. We will then progress onto learning all about fractions, in particular, adding and subtracting fractions with the same denominator, finding equivalent fractions and fractions of amounts.

Alongside this, we will continue to retrieve information from previous topics: Place Value (Hundreds, Tens and Ones, Column Addition and Column Subtraction, Column Multiplication and Division). In Year 3, we look at the numbers up to 1000.

The children should already be fluent in their 2's, 5's and 10 times tables. This half-term, we will consolidate how to count in 3's, 4's, 8's, and 11's, alongside counting in 10's, 50's and 100's - fram any given number. Please continue to engage with Times.

Tables Rack Stars and Daily 10 (Top marks) at home, to assist with this.

Geography:

Our topic is called 'Natural Disasters'. Our Learning Quests within lessons will enable us to explore the following:

LQI: What are the layers of the Earth?

LQ2: Where do volcanoes and earthquakes occur and which are the famous volcanoes in the world?

LQ3: What causes a volcano to erupt?

LQ4: What causes an earthquake and how are they measured?
LQ5: Why do people live near volcano and earthquake zones?
LQ6: Who experiences extreme weather in our country?

Science:

Our topic this half-term is **'The**Structure and Function of Plants'.

Our Learning Quests within lessons

will enable us to explore the

following:

LQI: What are the functions of the different parts of flowering plants and what are the requirements of plants for life and growth?
LQ2: What are the two different types of plants and how is water transported within plants?
LQ3: Which process do plants use to make their own food?
LQ4: How are seeds and fruits produced?

We will also be studying **Scientists**, **Explorers and Inventors**, in particular – **Isaac Newton**.

Religious Education:

Our topic is all about 'Which Rules Should We Follow?' Our **Learning Quests** within lessons will enable us to explore the following:

<u>LQI</u>: What is the purpose of a set of rules?

LQ2: What does the story of Moses teach us about the impact of the Ten Commandments?

LQ3: In what ways do Christians live out Jesus' command to love one another?

LQ4: Which rules should Christians follow?

<u>LQ5</u>: How can Christians today live out the Ten Cmmandments given by God and Jesus?

Design and Technology:

In class, we will be completing a Textiles project, involving 2D and 3D shapes, to make **juggling balls**.

Art:

We are going to be consolidating our understanding of Victorian vs. Contemporary art, with a particular focus on drawing and mixed
