Spring 2 Learning Menu

This half-term in Year 3 we are learning:

English:

Our book this half-term is **'Stitch Head' by Guy Bass**. We will be
using this text to inspire the
following:

- A radio advert to advertise Fulbert Freakfinder's 'Freak Show'.
- A non-chronological report based on their own Stitch Head inspired creature.
- A story with a familiar setting, where the children will have the opportunity to write their own version of part of the Stitch Head story, with reference to detailed character and setting descriptions.

Alongside this, we will be reading lots of books as a class and we will start our daily reading with a text linked to Parish Spirit called 'Planet Omar – Accidental Trouble Magnet'.

Each day, we will be continuing to revise Set 2 and 3 Phonics. sounds, Year 3 Spellings and cursive/joined handwriting. Please continue to access Spelling Frame.

Maths:

In Maths, we are continuing with our **Measurement** unit and we will be learning about **Maney** and **Time**.

Alongside this, we will continue to retrieve information from previous topics: Place Value (Hundreds, Tens and Ones, Column Addition and Column Subtraction, Column Multiplication and Division). In Year 3, we look at the numbers up to 1000.

The children should already be fluent in their 2's, 5's and 10 times tables. This half-term, we will consolidate how to count in 3's, 4's, 8's, and 11's, alongside counting in 10's, 50's and 100's - fram any given number. Please continue to engage with Times.

Tables Rack Stars and Daily 10 (Top marks) at home, to assist with this.

Each day, the children will be practicing their **counting** and **arithmetic** skills too.

History:

Our topic is called 'The Victorians'.

will enable us to explore the

LQI: When was the Victorian era? LQ2: Who was Queen Victoria? LQ3: What was a Victorian St Helens like?

LQ4: What was life like for Victorian children?

LQ5: What was the industrial

revolution?

We will also be studying **National** and International Achievers, in particular **Helen Keller**.

Science:

Our topic this half-term is 'Light and Shadaws'. Our Learning Quests within lessons will enable us to explore the fallowing:

LQI: What is light?
LQ2: How is light reflected from surfaces to help us to see things?
LQ3: How are shadows formed?
LQ4: How do shadows change when the distance between the light source and the object changes?

Religious Education:

Our topic is all about 'Exploring the Sadness and Joy of Easter'. Our **Learning Quests** within lessons will enable us to explore the following:

LQI: In what ways do Christians experience a sense of both joy and sadness at Easter time?

LQ3: How do the events of Holy Week depict a mixture of emotions?

LQ4: How do the events of Holy Week reveal what Jesus came to Earth to do?
