ACHIEVEMENTS OUTSIDE SCHOOL



SUCCESSFUL GROUNDS DAY


It was a very successful Grounds Day on Saturday with some lovely dry Autumn weather!

MESSAGE FROM THE LOCAL GOVERNING BOARD

Dear Parents and Carers,

The LGB met last week at the first Local Governing Board of the new academic year 2025-26.

After re-electing Franck Schmidlin to the role of Chair and Linsey Carroll to that of Vice-Chair we've confirmed the linked roles, with each governor assigned specific areas of interest.

The main item of our agenda was the challenges of supporting pupils with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) in Key Stage 1, particularly in delivering an adapted curriculum in a small school with such a varied intake. Our thanks to Mrs Wilkinson and Miss Hopkins for their informative presentation and insights. It's worth repeating how proud we are of Belgrave's SEND successes in the face of lack of funding or any actionable support from local or national government.

As a board, we've also discussed a small but concerning rise in inappropriate behaviours directed at staff, which we'll address in a subsequent letter.

Finally, we'd like to congratulate pupils, parents, caters and staff for impressive attendance numbers so far this half-term.
