YEAR 5 TRIP TO RIVER DEE



Year 5 enjoyed a trip to the River Dee in October to learn about the history and architecture of Chester. They walked many steps and observed the weir, the tidal aspect of the Dee and also sketched two bridges in preparation for artwork back at school.

They learnt about sandstone; the bedrock of Cheshire and saw examples of where it was used. The weather stayed dry and the adults were really impressed with the children's enthusiasm and questions throughout the trip.









YEAR 4 ROMAN TRIP TO CHESTER

Their day out included a visit to the historic amphitheatre and finding out about the walls and surrounding areas. The children were very

PARENTAL FEEDBACK



In July, we asked you to complete the parent survey to tell us what you believe we do well and your suggestions to make our school even better.

It was very clear from the responses we received that the following areas were very important to families:

Welcoming, friendly, teaching, sport, support, staff, care, school clubs, school life, community, warmth, environment, communication, supportive, Mandarin, respect

Two suggestions for further improvement included:

• Keeping gymnastics and yoga clubs with the offer for older children — Sam from Yoga Tales (our Yoga external provider) is fully booked and Sam keeps a waiting list for any spaces which become available. Yoga is available to all children from Years 1-6.

- More competitive sports Mr Moss enters us into many competitive competitions throughout the academic year and all pupils by the end of Year 6 will have represented school in at least one competition. Last year we entered: Hockey, Netball, Football, Tag Rugby, Athletics, Multi-skills, Cross country, Cricket and Rounders competitions. We have now been part of setting up to become part of the local school's cluster of competitive sports events which will give an additional opportunity for pupils to compete in sports.
- More opportunities for Digital Wizards club we have arranged with the external provider so an additional series of sessions can be accessed during the academic year and then all pupils can receive a place.

Chaps Visit to School

Before half term, we were joined by Emily from ChAPS, a registered charity founded by parents of autistic children to support other families. ChAPS has over 15 years experience in supporting autistic and neurodivergent individuals of all ages. In a whole school assembly, children explored our differences and similarities alongside things that some people might find harder than others.

It was important for us all to recognise that people with Autism find some things more difficult at times and how we can all help to support each other with any differences we see in each other.





Emily was impressed that this is so in-keeping with our Belgrave No Outsiders motto 'We are all different and we are all welcome'. Thank you to the ten parents who joined us at the coffee afternoon for a Parent session led by ChAPS. We stand with autistic and neurodivergent individuals and their families, partnering with schools, employers, and communities to create a society that values and includes everyone.


