Attendance & Punctuality

Your child's education is important!

Research shows that children who attend school regularly are likely to achieve and be more successful. A child who misses a day of school each week misses an equivalent of two whole years in their school life ... this obviously leads to huge gaps in their knowledge.

As parents/carers, you can help ...

Help your child develop a routine (in the evenings, a routine of homework, tea, watching TV, reading, getting bag ready for tomorrow and plenty of sleep. In the mornings, having breakfast helps to speed up the metabolism which makes children more alert and ready for learning.

Don't give in to your child if she complains of illness but you see no physical signs (if you are not sure, send a note in to the class teacher asking them to keep an eye on them ... we will contact you if their symptoms do not improve. This will help your child develop the right habits for the world of work, where absence and lateness are rarely tolerated)

Reward your child (we reward good attendance at school, you could add your own rewards at home to show that we share the same values)

Help your child to be successful at school and work (emphasise the importance of having a good school attendance record)

Homework expectations

Homework:

In line with our school homework policy, the pupils in year five will be expected to complete the following homework each week -

- Reading books each night/Reading Plus x 4 times weekly
- Spellings
- TTRS x3 arithmetic independent practice
- SPAG practice
- Weekly homework Set on Friday, due in on Monday

If you wish to see a copy of the policy which outlays the requirements for teachers, parents/guardians and pupils, please ask for a copy from the school office.

Reading:

Children are expected to read their school reading books daily at home for ten minutes per day. They should be heard read by an adult who can then sign their reading record book. These should also be brought to school daily. Books will be changed by the TA at a set time during the week.

Times tables:

Being fluent in times tables up to 12×12 is essential to support mathematical understanding in Year 5. Children will be using 'Times Tables Rockstars' in school most days and will be expected to log on at home if they have access to the internet to reinforce their understanding.
